Crochet Pattern **Edging Picot**

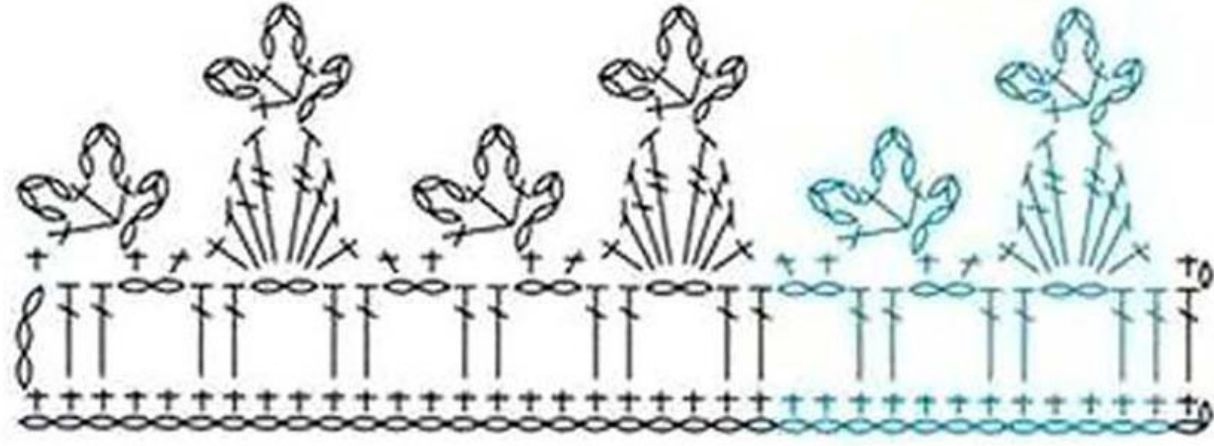


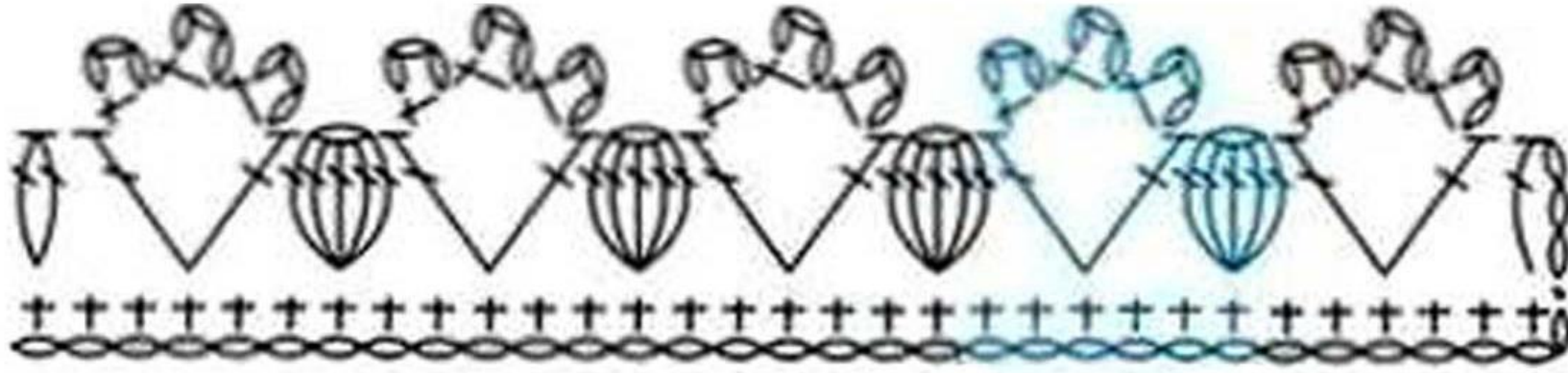
Some beginners find crochet edging picot a bit difficult. But with a little practice, you'll see that it's a pretty easy way to give your crocheted project a pretty finish. Making a few chains and then a slip stitch or single crochet at the base of the chain is all it takes, you will learn it in no time.

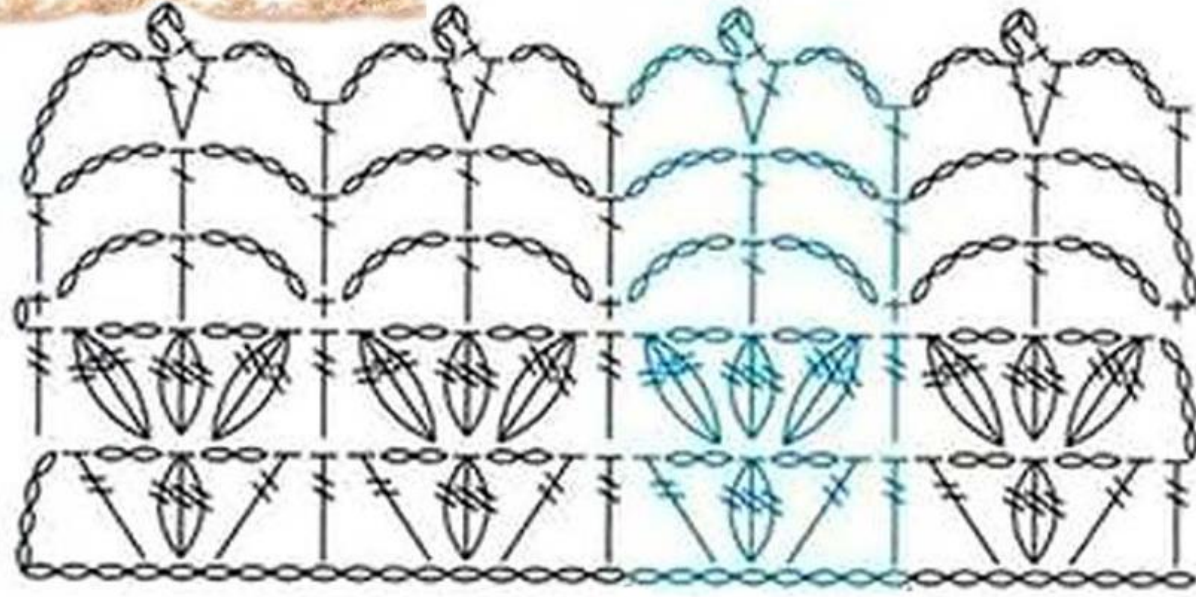
You can vary the look and size of your picot edging by varying the number of chains you make and the distance between them. These edgings can be used as a decoration straight on to the edge of a piece of crochet or as an addition to a fancier border.

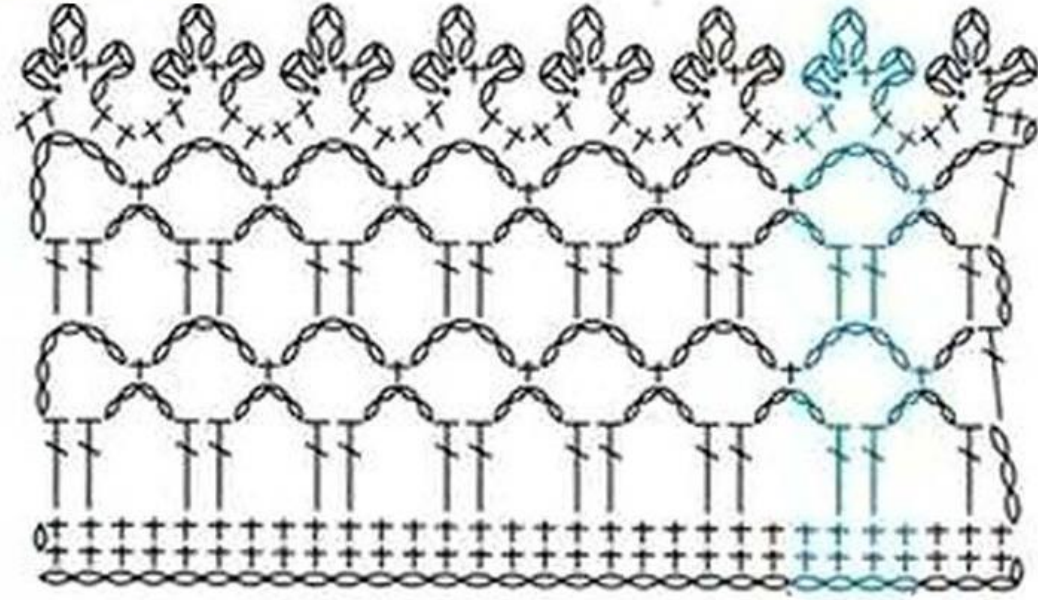
What do you need to crochet this project?

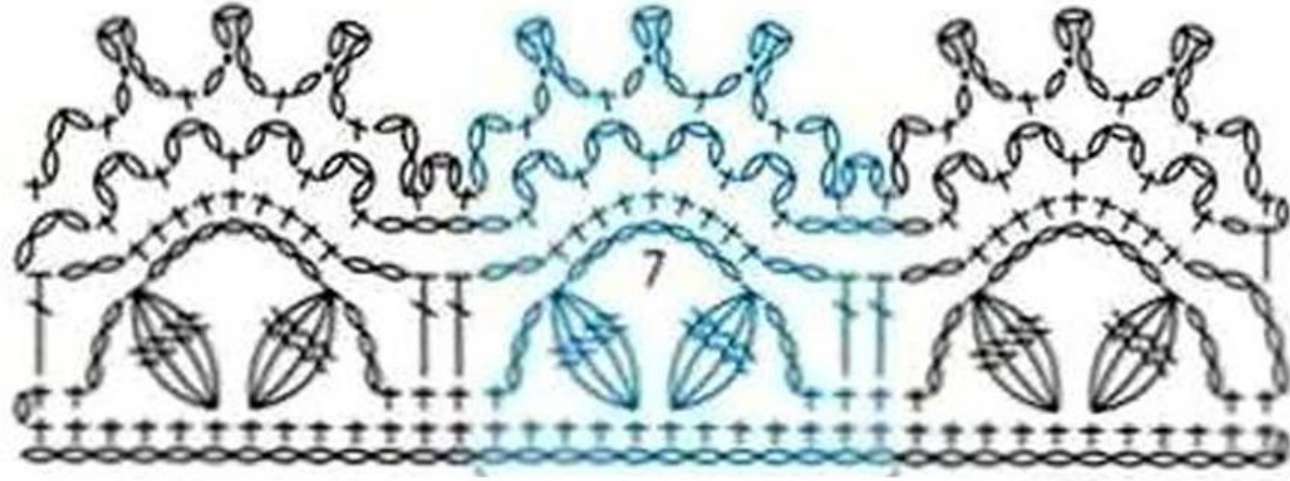
- **Crochet hook** size 2.5 mm
- **Yarn:**
 - yardage: 1.76 Oz (50g) / 185 Yrds (169m)
 - weight: Fingering (14 wpi) / Super Fine
 - fiber type: 100% mercerized cotton

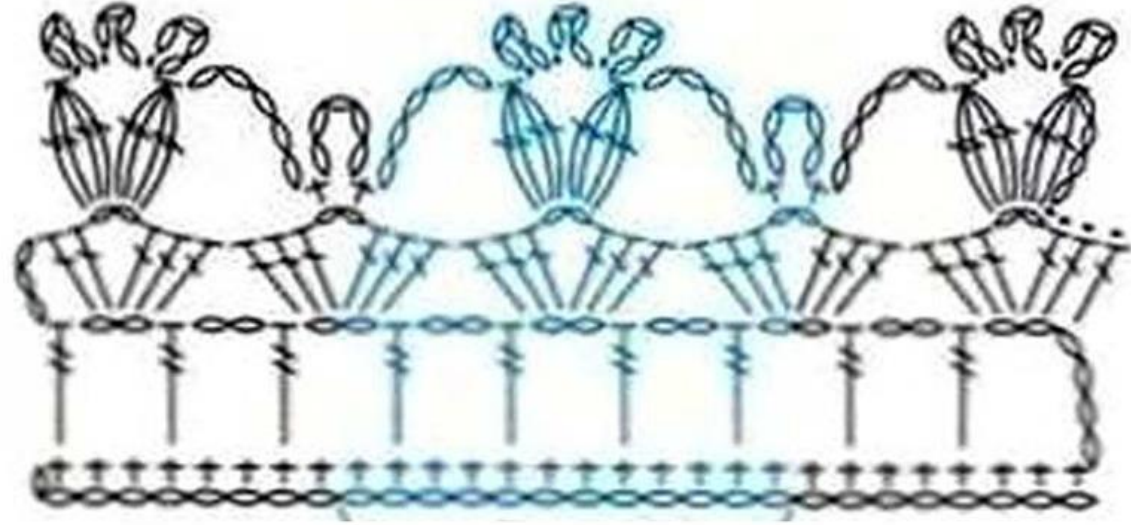


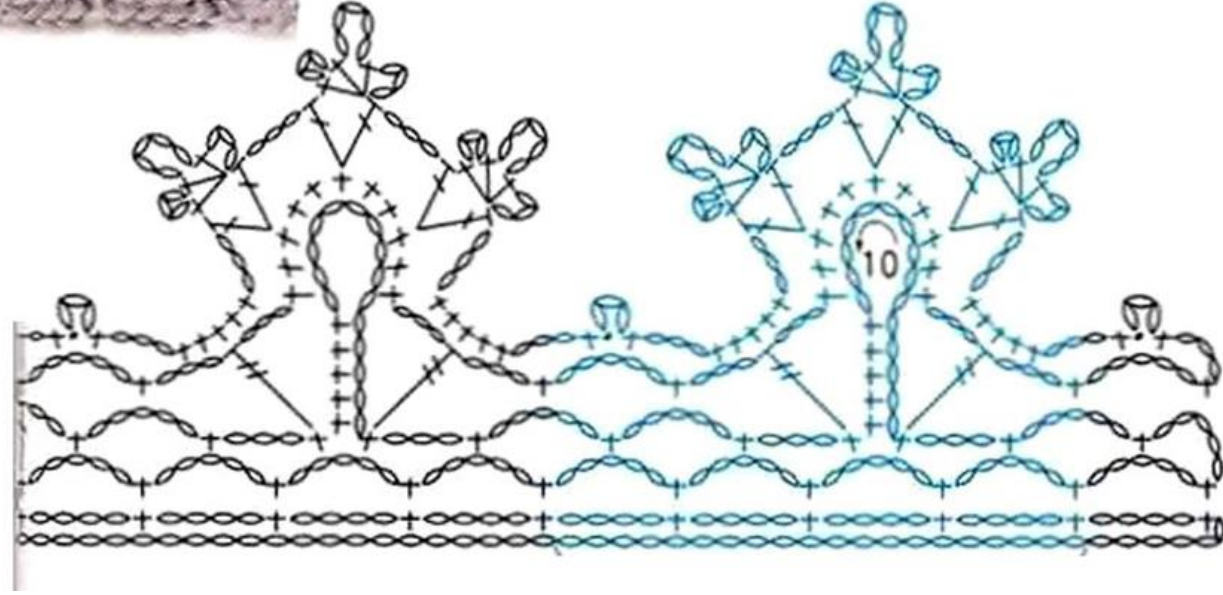
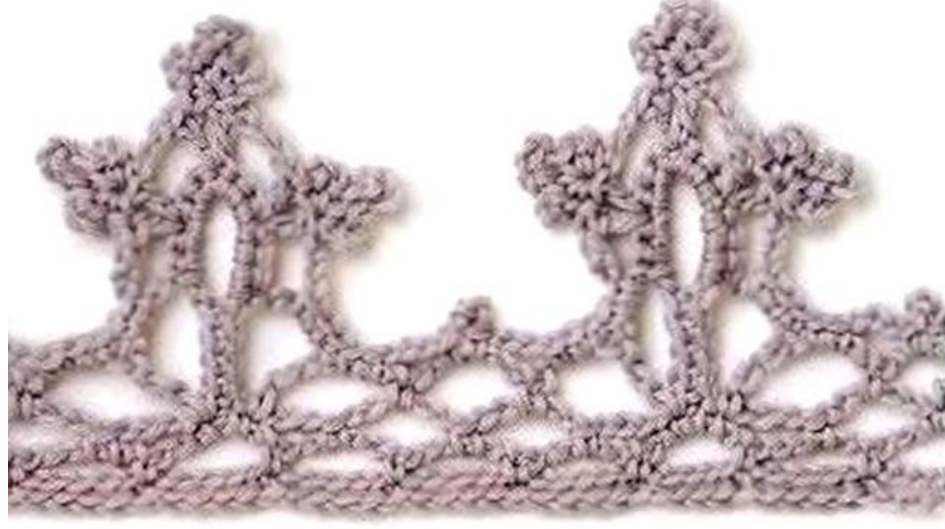


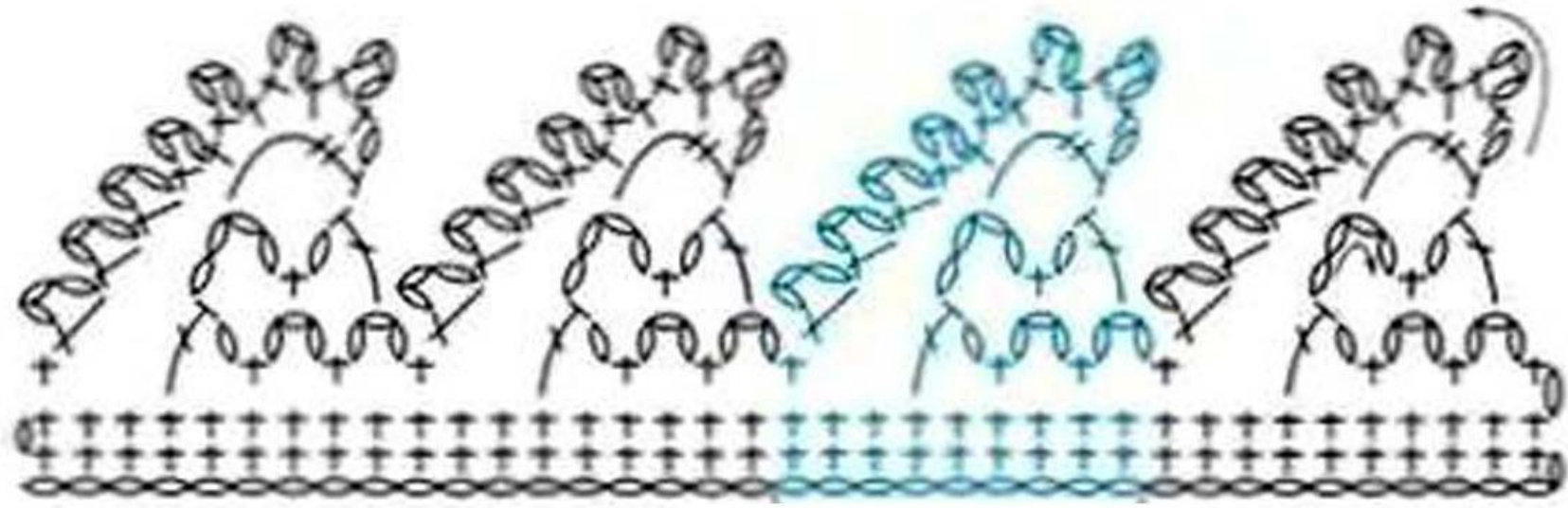


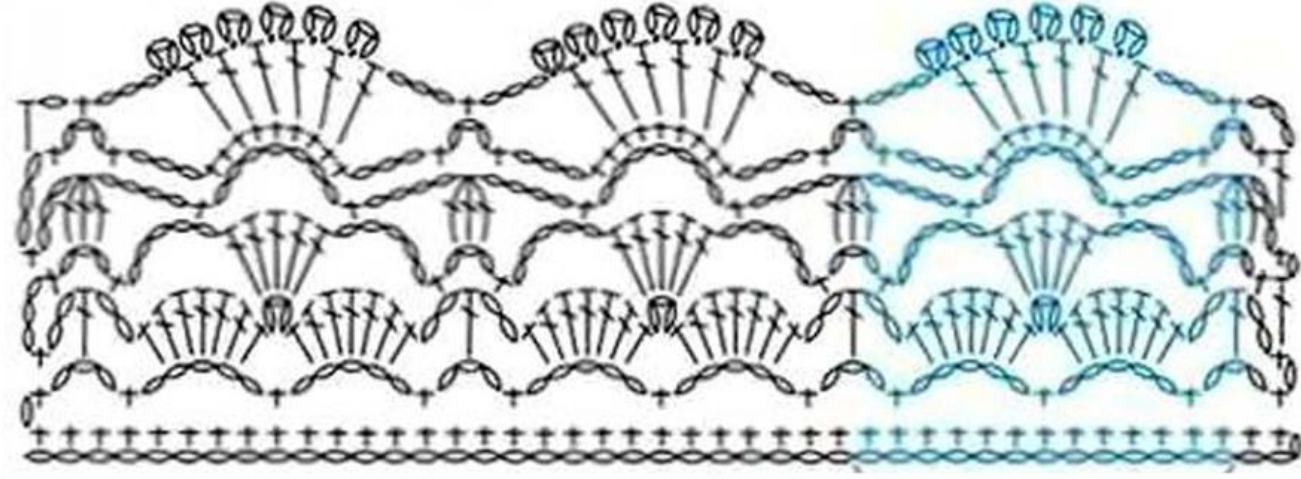


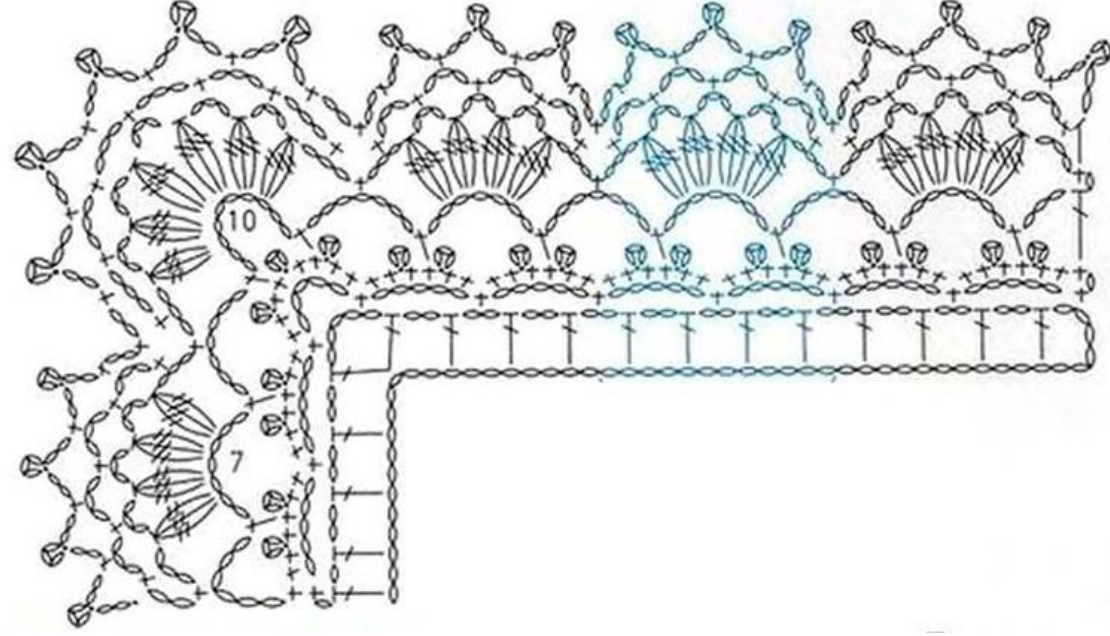
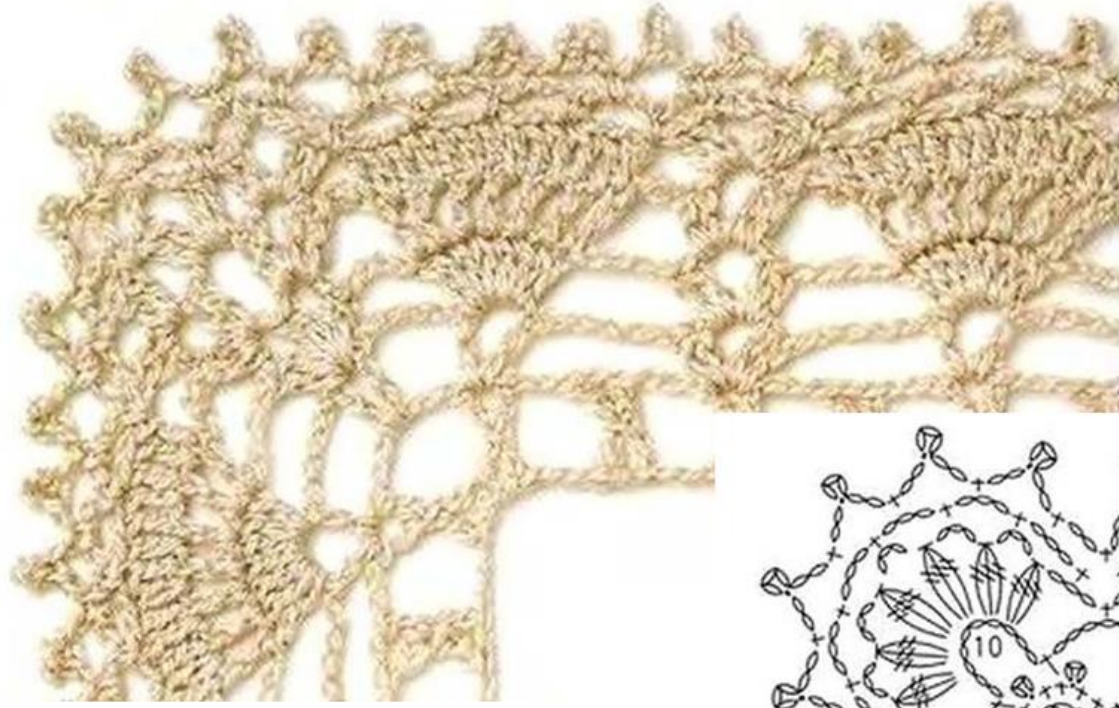


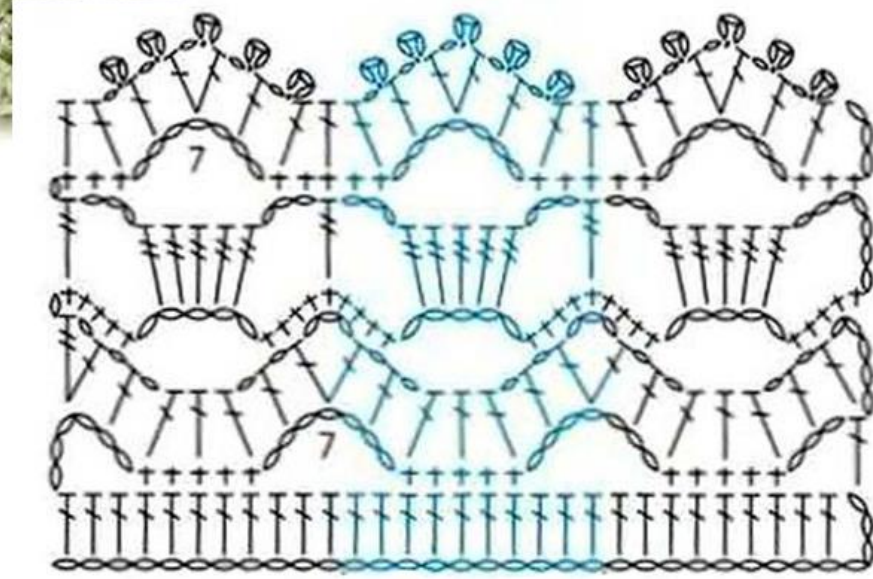


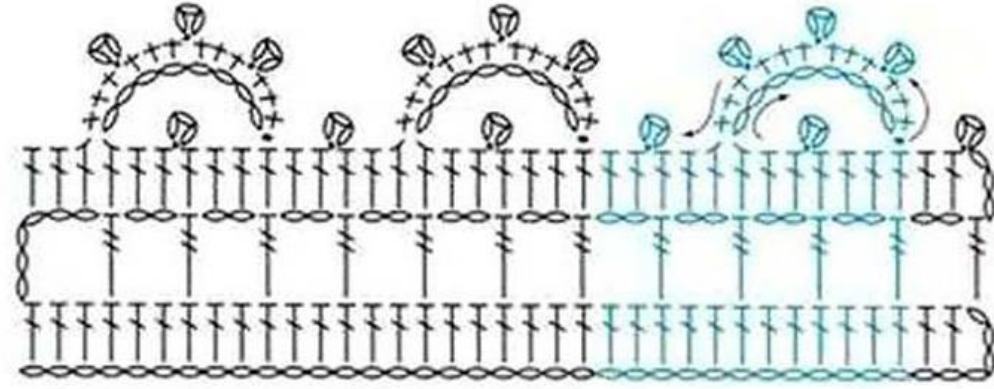
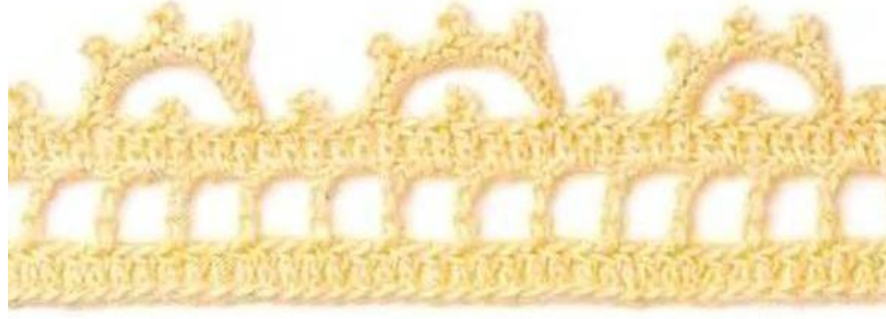


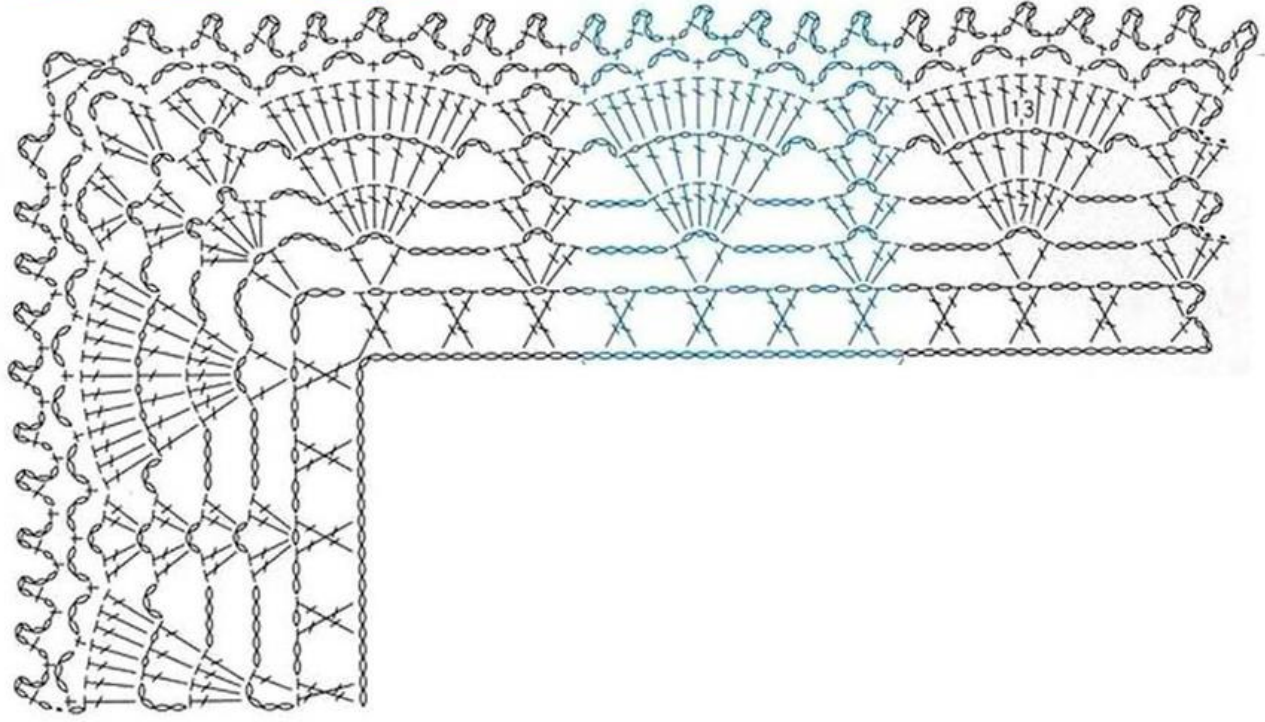
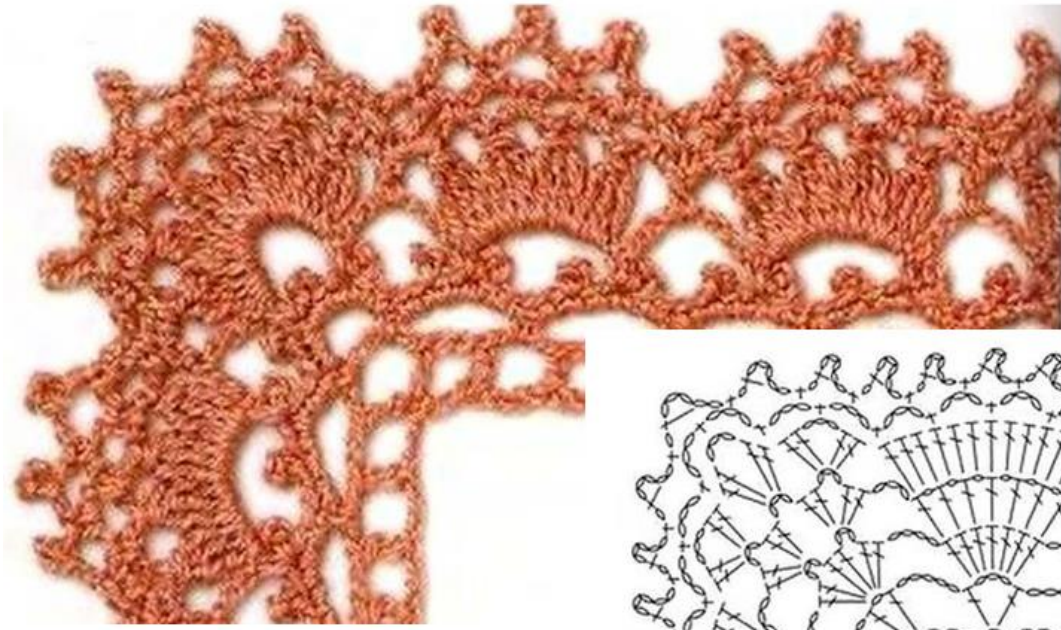


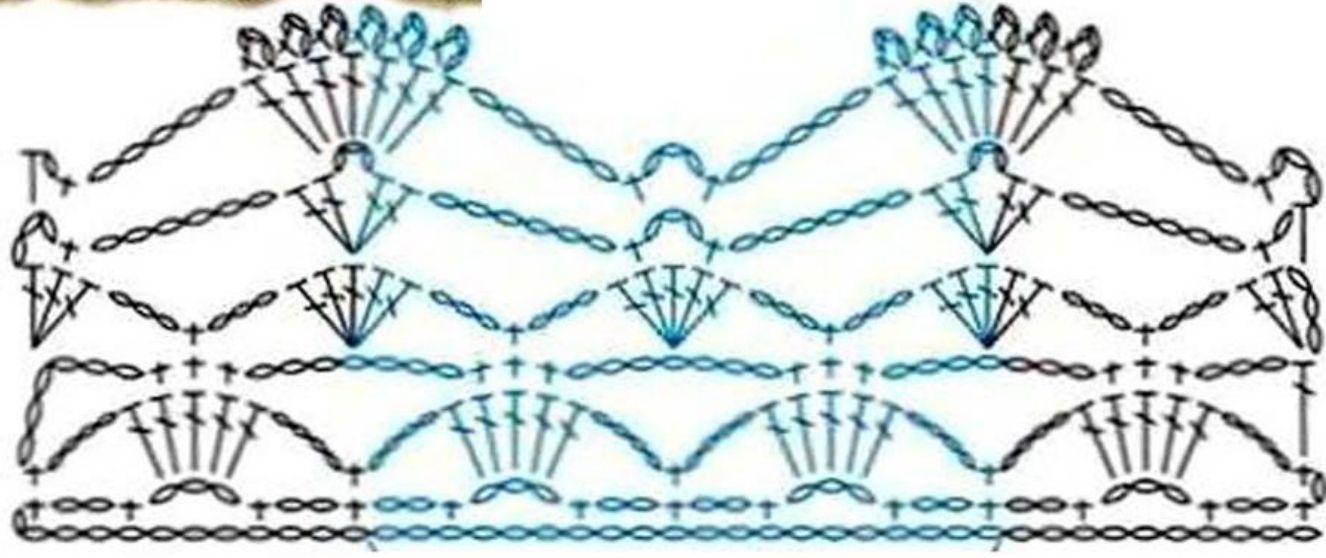












Basic crochet stitch
